PRINCIPAL'S POST



Welcome back to Term 3 and we hope you had a relaxing holiday. I have talked to many children and parents about their holidays and everyone had a restful and relaxed time. The children and teachers are always excited to be back and classes have settled back into routine quickly.

Term 3 is always action packed with lots of events, please check our website, school app calendar and Facebook page for upcoming events.

Thank you to all of those who attended the HomeSchool Conferences last week. We had 87% attendance. If you were unable to attend the conferences please contact your child's teacher and they will schedule a time for you.

Term 3 Learning: We are delighted to partner with Mitey over the next year to grow and support the mental health and wellbeing of all our students – this will be a focus this term.

The Sir John Kirwan Foundation has designed Mitey with NZ teachers and the University of Auckland to provide an evidence-based approach to teaching mental health education to primary and intermediate aged children.

It is built around the NZ curriculum and embedded into everyday learning, to ensure children are equipped with the age-appropriate skills and knowledge they need to recognise and respond to mental health issues in both themselves and others before they enter teenage years.

Mitey has successfully implemented its approach to schools in Auckland and we are excited to be included.

This is how it works: A Mitey coach will work with staff to support teaching and learning. This will also ensure Mitey is tailored to our school's unique culture and community.

Mental health education will be taught in every classroom with the skills, knowledge and understanding of mental health woven into what is already being taught by our teachers.

Parents and the whole school community are an integral part of Mitey's approach and as with all our learning your engagement and support is a key aspect of educating our students.

Why the need?: Mental health concerns and issues amongst NZ youth have doubled in the past 10 years and we all agree that unhappy students don't learn.

TE REO – SRS WHAKATAUKĪ OF THE MONTH



Kia ora Stanhope Road School Whānau. It is great to be able to continue our Te Reo journey with you all. This term we are moving from kupu to Whakataukī.

Whakataukī (proverbs) represent the wisdom guiding the Māori culture. They provide life lessons, guidance, notes of caution and sometimes a source of comfort.

Whakataukī are commonly used as inspirations in speeches and also as gentle reminders spoken to each other in everyday life.

We encourage you to practice and read these whakataukī with your tamariki at home.

Our first whakataukī reflects the idea that a bird cannot fly without feathers BUT if you give the bird what it needs, it can thrive.

**Mā te huruhuru ka rere te manu
Adorn the bird with feathers so it may soar.**

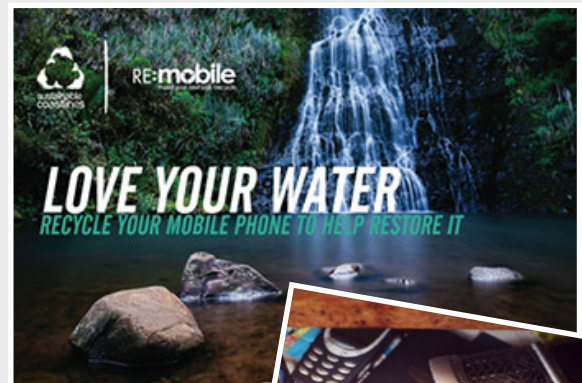
