# PRINCIPAL'S POST



As we come to the end of a term like no other, I would like to thank all the amazing teachers, staff, students and parents and wider community for what we have achieved. This has been our longest lockdown of 6.5 weeks and we have all shown huge character and resilience to still be smiling.

School Chrome Books - We have 190 school devices (\$76,000 of school capital) currently with a large number of families. These must be returned on the first day we are back on site. A reminder these are only to be used for school work. With holidays beginning this weekend, these devices are kindly not to be used for personal use and should be stored safely away until they can be returned after the holidays.

**Term 4 –** We have our fingers crossed that we will be able to welcome everyone back onsite on Monday 18 October and realistically this will most likely be with Alert Level 2 protocols in place. Please see page 7 for a summary of what Level 2 looks like. We will also send communications in the second week of the holidays with further information.

We still hope to run a number of our events in Term 4. Please remember to check the website and App Calendar for key dates.



# **LEVEL 2 @** STANHOPE ROAD SCHOOL

In the classroom we will continue with most of our routines for learning IN THE **CLASSROOM** → Supplies for sanitising and/or washing hands will be routinely used → Students encouraged to use all available space in the classroom No assemblies or Kapa haka Trips and events will be reviewed on a case by case basis → Sports fields and playgrounds open  $\rightarrow$  PE gear cleaned **OUTSIDE PE** → Swimming pool open AND PLAY → All students to have drink bottles  $\rightarrow$  Water fountains are closed ➔ No contact sports → Students encouraged to use all available space and socially distance, 1 metre apart where possible → All parents/caregivers entering the school grounds must scan DROPOFFS in via QR code, school app or paper sign in AND PICKUPS → Year 1 and 2 students collected from Harris Road and Ellerslie/ Panmure Highway gates at 2.50pm ➔ Year 3-8 students will exit grounds at 3.00pm → School gates are locked between 9.00am and 2.45pm WELLBEING/ **CLEANING &** HAUORA HYGIENE
